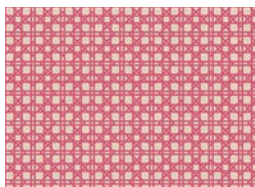

CUTTING DIRECTIONS

¼" seam allowances are included.
WOF means width of fabric.

Fabric A

- Cut 5 (five) 4½" x WOF strips.
- Cut 10 (ten) 2½" x WOF strips.
- Cut 3 (three) 2½" x WOF strips, then;
Sub-cut into
 - 2 (two) 2½" x 6½" rectangles.
 - 8 (eight) 2½" x 4½" rectangles.
 - 14 (fourteen) 2½" squares.

Fabric B

- Cut 3 (three) 6½" x WOF strips.
- Cut 2 (two) 4½" x WOF strips.
- Cut 1 (one) 2½" x WOF strip.
- Cut 4 (four) 2½" x WOF strips, then;
Sub-cut into
 - 5 (five) 2½" x 6½" rectangles.
 - 18 (eighteen) 2½" x 4½" rectangles.
 - 6 (six) 2½" squares.

Fabric C

- Cut 1 (one) 4½" x WOF strip.
- Cut 2 (two) 2½" x WOF strips.
- Cut 2 (two) 2½" x WOF strips, then;
Sub-cut into
 - 2 (two) 2½" x 6½" rectangles.
 - 3 (three) 2½" x 4½" rectangles.
 - 7 (seven) 2½" squares.

Fabric D

- Cut 4 (four) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips.
- Cut 1 (one) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, then;
Sub-cut into
- 10 (ten) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric E

- Cut 1 (one) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips.
- Cut 4 (four) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips.
- Cut 1 (one) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, then;
Sub-cut into
- 2 (two) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares..

Fabric F

- Cut 3 (three) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips.
- Cut 1 (one) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, then;
Sub-cut into
- 9 (nine) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric G

- Cut 2 (two) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips.
- Cut 2 (two) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips.
- Cut 1 (one) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, then;
Sub-cut into
- 1 (one) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle.
- 5 (five) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles.
- 3 (three) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric H

- Cut 1 (one) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, then;
Sub-cut into
- 7 (seven) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric I

- Cut 1 (one) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, then;
Sub-cut into
- 6 (six) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric J

- Cut 2 (two) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips.
- Cut 1 (one) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, then;
Sub-cut into
- 8 (eight) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric K

- Cut 32 (two) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips.
- Cut 3 (three) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips.
- Cut 2 (two) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips, then;
Sub-cut into
- 1 (one) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle.
- 5 (five) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles.
- 14 (fourteen) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric L

- Cut 8 (eight) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips.
- Cut 1 (one) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, then;
Sub-cut into
- 5 (five) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric M

- Cut 1 (one) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip.
- Cut 11 (eleven) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips.
- Cut 12 (twelve) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips.

- Cut 5 (five) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips, then;
Sub-cut into
 - 9 (nine) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles.
 - 12 (twelve) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles.
 - 26 (twenty six) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

Fabric N

- Cut 8 (eight) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. (Binding)

CONSTRUCTION

Sew all rights sides together with $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.

Strip Set 1:

- Take one (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip from fabrics **M**, **F** and **J**, one (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip from fabric **G**, and sew them together in the order shown on diagram 1, repeat the same step one (1) more time.
- Cut thirty one (31) vertical strips every $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".

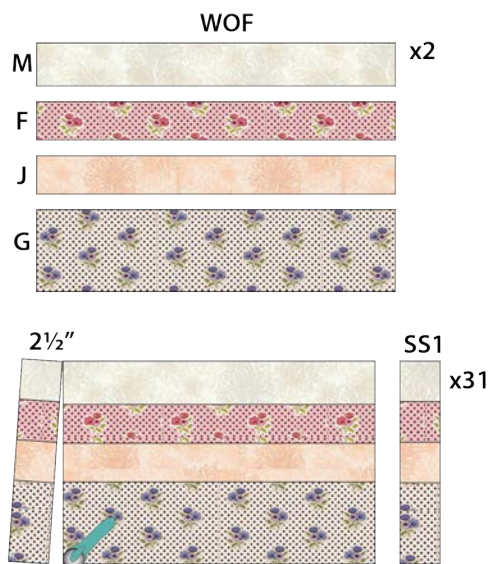


DIAGRAM 1

Strip Set 2:

- Take one (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip from fabric **D**, and one (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip from fabrics **K** and **A**, sew them together in the order shown on diagram 2. Repeat the same step one (1) more time.
- Cut twenty five (25) vertical strips every $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".

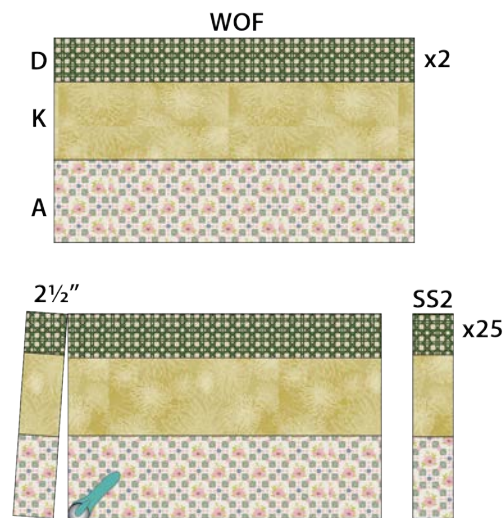


DIAGRAM 2

Strip Set 3:

- Take one (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip from fabrics **L**, **A**, **K**, **E** and **M**, sew them together in the order shown on diagram 3, and repeat the same step one (1) more time.
- Cut twenty four (24) vertical strips every $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".

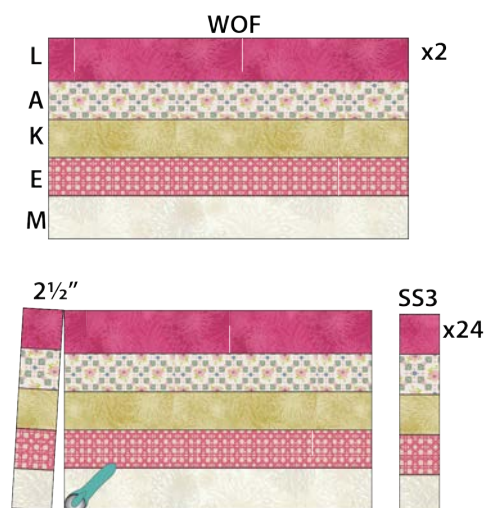

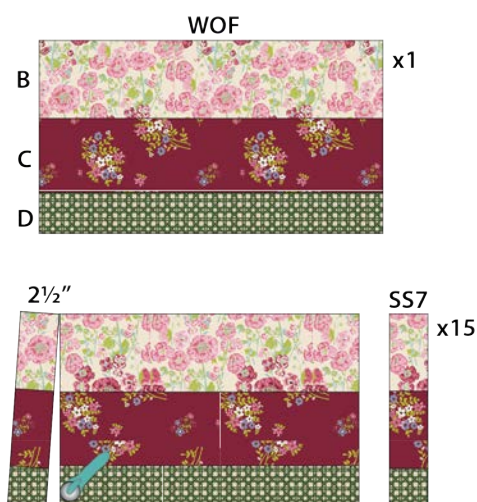

Strip Set 13:

- Take one (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip from fabric **M**, and one (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip from fabric **E**, sew them together in the order shown on diagram 13.
- Cut six (6) vertical strips every $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".

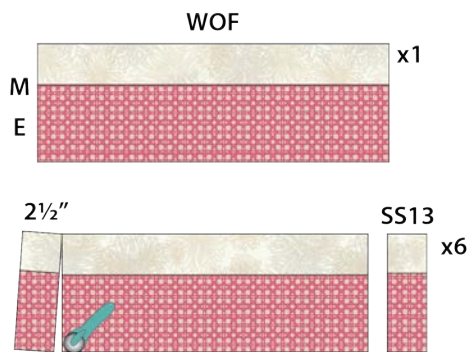

Strip Set 14:

- Take one (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip from fabric **M**, and one (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip from fabric **E**, sew them together in the order shown on diagram 14.
- Cut five (5) vertical strips every $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".

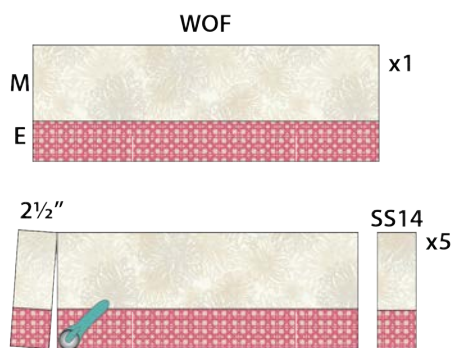

Strip Set 15:

- Take one (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip from fabrics **A**, and **M**, sew them together in the order shown on diagram 15.
- Cut five (5) vertical strips every $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".

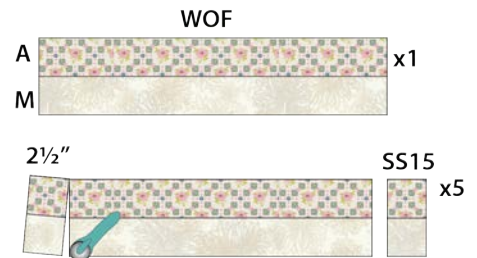

QUILT TOP

Sew all rights sides together with $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.

- Arrange all Strip Sets and the rest of the pieces into 36 (thirty six) columns.

- For fabric placement and attachment of columns 1 thru 12 see diagram 16.

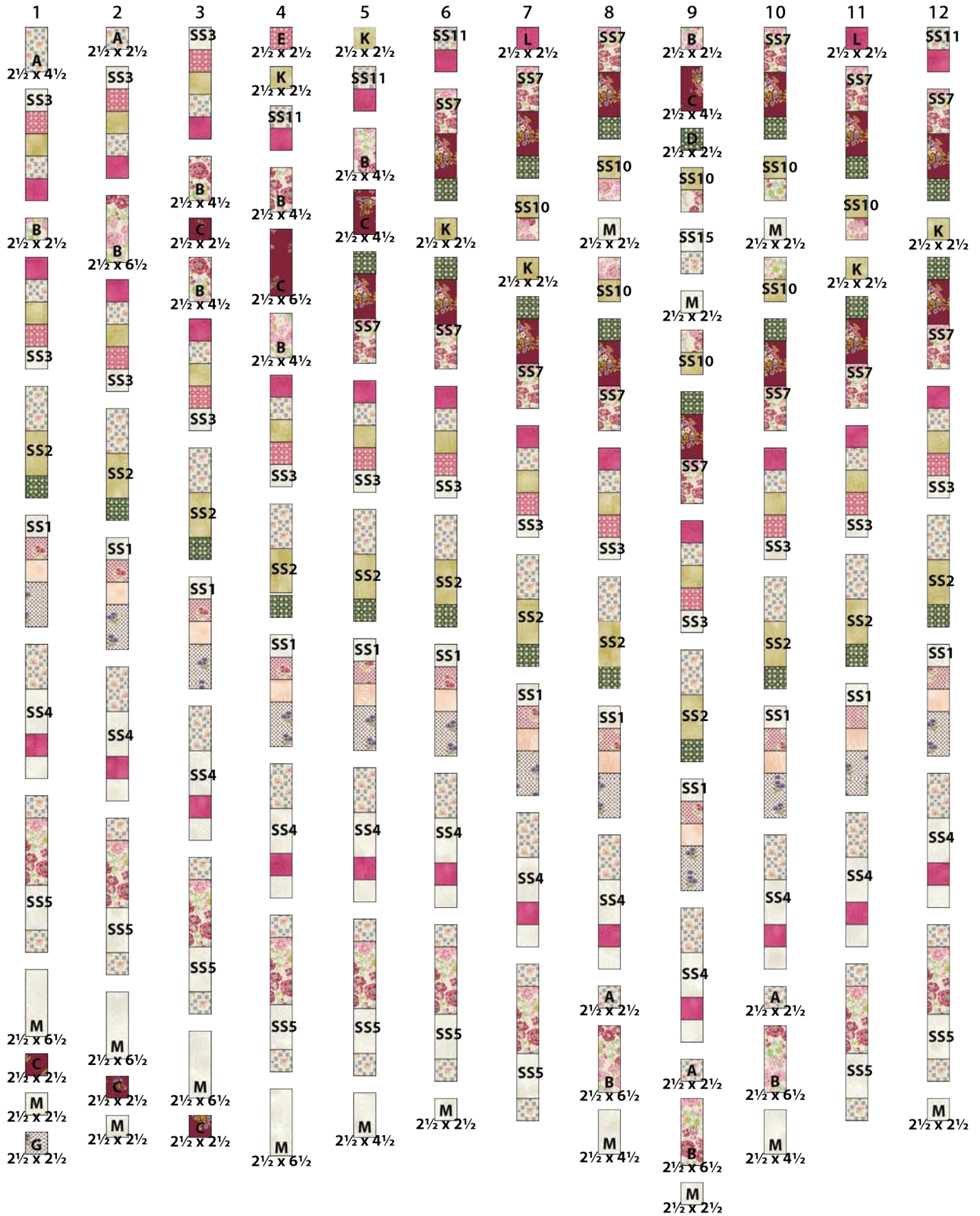

- Sew all 36 (thirty six) columns as shown on diagram 19.

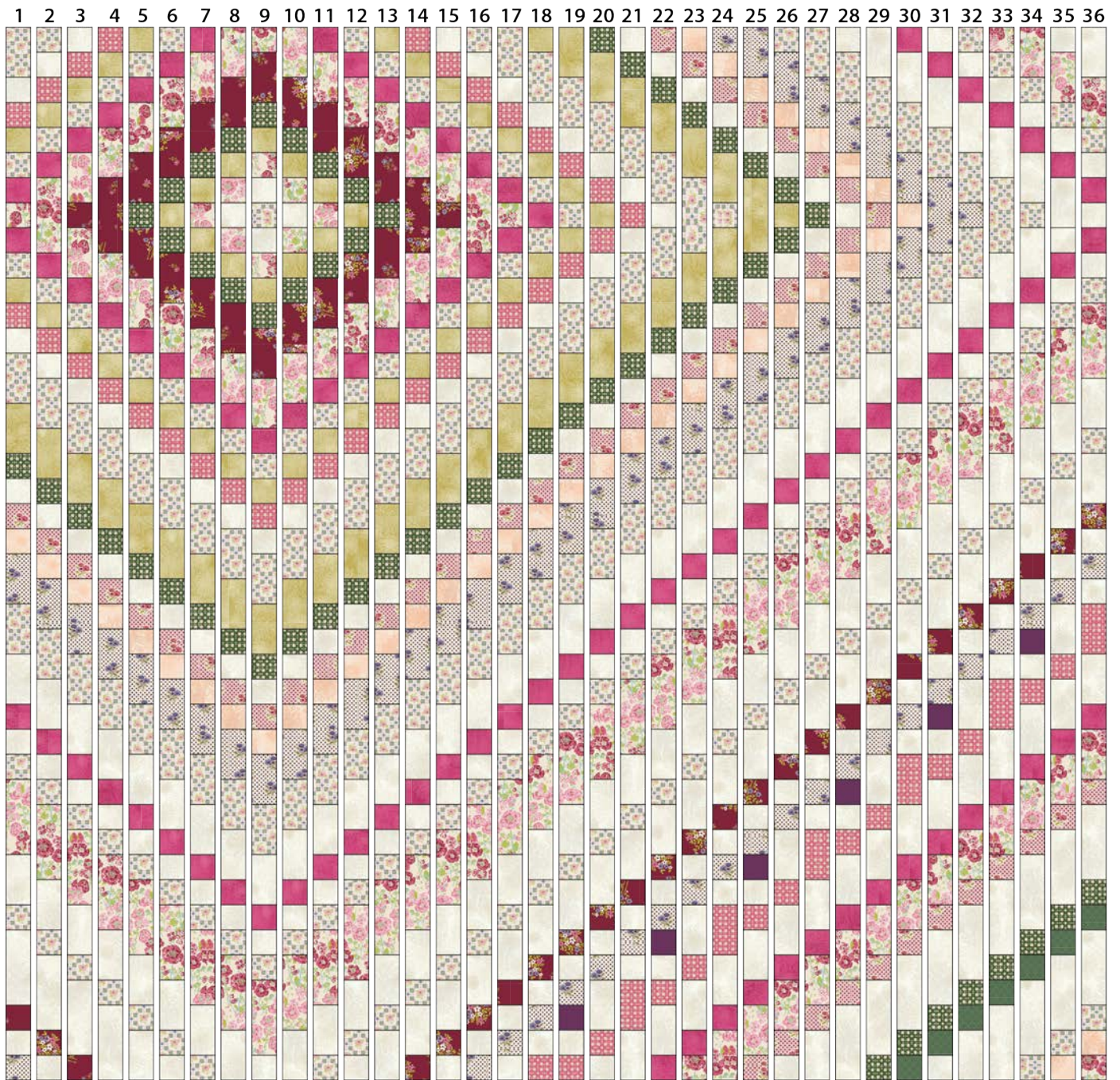


DIAGRAM 19

QUILT ASSEMBLY

Sew rights sides together.

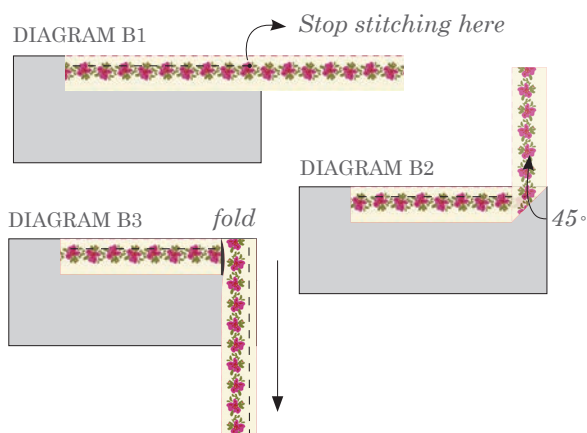
- Place BACKING FABRIC on a large surface wrong side up. Stretch it with masking tape against that surface.
- Place BATTING on top of backing fabric.
- Place TOP on top of the batting with right side facing up. Smooth away wrinkles using your hands.
- Pin all layers together and baste with basting thread, using long stitches. You can also use safety pins to join the layers.
- Machine or hand quilt starting at the center and working towards the corners. Remember that quilting motifs are a matter of personal preference. Have fun choosing yours!
- After you finished, trim excess of any fabric or batting, squaring the quilt to proceed to bind it.

BINDING

Sew rights sides together.

- Sew eight (8) 2½" x WOF strips from fabric **N** to make a final strip 324" long. Start sewing the binding strip in the middle of one of the sides of the quilt, placing the strip right side down and leaving an approximated 5" tail. Sew with ¼" seam allowance (using straight stitch), aligning the strip's raw edge with the quilt top's raw edge.

- Stop stitching ¼" before the edge of the quilt (DIAGRAM B 1). Clip the threads. Remove the quilt from under the machine presser foot. Fold the strip in a motion of 45° and upward, pressing with your fingers (DIAGRAM B2). Hold this fold with your finger, bring the strip down in line with the next edge, making a horizontal fold that aligns with the top edge of the quilt (DIAGRAM B3). Start sewing at ¼" of the border, stitching all the layers. Do the same in the four corners of the quilt.
- Stop stitching before you reach the last 5 or 6 inches. Cut the threads and remove the quilt from under the machine presser foot. Lay the loose ends of the binding flat along the quilt edge, folding the ends back on themselves where they meet. Press them together to form a crease. Using this crease as the stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding with right sides together (you can help yourself marking with a pen/cil if the crease is difficult to see).
- Trim seam to ¼" and press open. Complete the sewing. Turn binding to back of the quilt, turn raw edge inside and stitch by hand using blind stitch.
